Tuesday May 17 Helen dropped in on the Polish WAF dance festival at Lenox Hill House. The exhibition group of 12 girls and 2 boys (they have 264 boys in the service!) was quite striking in the Krakow costume. This is one of the prettiest of the Polish costumes. The girls wear white blouses and beribboned white skirts, heavily beaded and embroidered velvet jackets with gay streaming ribbons attached to the shoulders, red boots, and garlands of flowers in their hair. The boys were the costume most of you have seen --- the same as worn by the Polish group of Mr. Matusz.

The group led by Frances Wesolowska (and is she good) put on quite a lively program: - Kujawiak, Polkas, Polka-mazurkas, Oberek, Mazur, Krakowiak ect. There were several solo versions of these which is quite unusual, the solo polka of their leader being especially well

received.

After refreshments, Miss Wesolowska with her group demonstrating, led the audience through some simple Polish folk steps.

We hope you will all get a chance to see them in action at our

square and folk dance picnic this summer.

My latest square dance call seems to have really hit the bell. Here is the official version of it. Tune: - Upidee.

Rods' Polka Quadrille
The two head couples right hand star; upidee, upidah,
Back with the left to where you were; upidee-a-dah,
Salute your corner - salute your pal,
Polka with that corner gal!

Upidee-a-dee-a-dah, upidee, upidah. Upidee-a-dee-a-dah, upidee-a-dah.

(Repeat 4 times)

The two head couples dos-a-dos; upidee, upidah,
Dos-a-dos your corners all; upidee, upidah,
Allemande your corners all; polka with your partners all!
Upidee-a-dee-a-dah, upidee, upidah.
Upidee-a-dee-a-dah, upidee-a-dah!

Repeat WKKI all of above with the side couples.

I wonder why the Central YWCA can't adopt a system of individual slips to fill out if they <u>must</u> have all their patron's names? People don't <u>like</u> to wait in those long lines while the squares go on whout them. No relief in coming early either; they won't start the registration until the first square is about ready to start!

The Bronx Allied Nations Rally, where we were invited to exhibit; has cancelled the folk dance portion of the program because of the

Two whole carloads of Rangers lost a perfectly good Saturday night snooping for new square dance resorts. We had been told that they square danced every Saturday night at Tompkins Cove, but on arrival there we found that their schedule was irregular --- we could go to Garnertown if we wished or wait until next Saturday at the Camp Hill School. Back in Haledon we found that they had given up the Sate nite squares at the Firehall, so on to the Haledon Dinar for a bite to eat --- and they were closed!
